

Knight of the Month Stan Adams March, 2009



April 2009 Gardening Tips

April is here and it is time to fertilize your lawns! Two to three weeks after your grass is completely green, use a fertilizer that contains at least 50% slow release Nitrogen (N). A blended fertilizer of slow release and guick release N begins fertilizing when applied and continues throughout the growing season. Fewer applications are required and there is less waste in sandy soils due to leaching. On St. Augustine, Bermuda, and Zoysia grass use 10 lb/1000 sq. ft of 16-4-8 fertilizer that is 50% slow release N. On Centipede and Carpet grass use 3-4 lb/1000 sg ft of 50% slow release N of either 16-4-8 or 15-0-15. Or, if you had a soil test done follow the instructions in the report you received. You can use the same 16-4-8 to fertilize your azaleas and camellias after the blooms are gone. Lawns can be sprigged, sodded or seeded when the average ground temperature is 65-70. Mow or hand pull weeds before their flowers turn to seed.


Prune Azaleas and spring flowering vines after the blooms are gone. Azaleas must not be pruned after July 1. After that time the next year's blossoms are being formed. Pinch back new buds and stems of chrysanthemums to prolong the blooming time. Take off dead flowers of snapdragons to keep them flowering.

Begin moving tender plants outside to a shady area. Acclimate them by gradually extending the length of time they are outside. Easter Lilies can be planted outside and then pruned after the leaves and stems die back. They might produce a second round of flowers in June. If you see aphids and/or spider mites on your plants spray them off in early morning with a strong stream of water. Spraying early helps prevent disease by allowing leaves to dry off before dusk.

Plant transplants of tomatoes, peppers, cucumbers etc. and seeds such as beans and annual flowers.

Look for "Knock Out" roses. They are pretty, easy to grow, and fairly maintenance free. Roses that bloom repeatedly can be fertilized with a slow release fertilizer now and again in mid-summer. When watering roses or any plant try to keep leaves from getting wet.

Think of planting for butterflies and hummingbirds. Zinnias, lantana, butterfly bush, plumbago, coral honeysuckle, red pentas, Lady in Red salvia, blue salvia, pineapple sage, and passionflower vine are some of the great attractors. For best results you should have at least 6-12 plants of the smaller flowers. (such as zinnias)
