

Richard was born in Caracas, Venezuela in 1965 as one of five siblings from a wonderful Catholic family. His mother Mary Ann was born in NY and his father Manuel was born in Spain, but his mother's roots came from Charleston. He moved to the US in 1982 to attend the Citadel and graduated in 1986 with a BS in Civil Engineering. Over the last 23 years he has served various engineering and construction firms with different assignments. Currently he serves as Vice President with two firms: Lindbergh & Associates and O'Brien & Gere. He married his wife Mary, who is a Charlestonian, in 1988. They have a 17 year-old daughter Cristina, who attends Bishop England and a 13 year-old son Ricky, who attends Christ Our King. They reside in Dunes West.

They are charter members of St. Benedict's parish he participates in many activities with the parish that include: FIRE, Usher, Building Committee, Men's group, and Stewardship committee. June Gardening 2009

With the growing season in full swing we are faced with many insect and disease problems. For any problems you can't solve on your own please call the local extension service for advice at 722-5940. Spider mites, whiteflies, and aphids are the most common insects. They can often be knocked off with a strong spray of water or with insecticidal soap (avoid using when temperature is over 90). If your lantanas stop blooming and the leaves curl and turn gray or black look on leaftips for lacebugs, a very tiny insect. Cut back damaged part and spray plant with insecticidal soap. High temperatures and moist soil can result in Southern blight, caused by a fungus which attacks stems at soil level. Leaves will turn yellow and the plant will collapse. These plants need to be dug up and discarded. The area should remain fallow for at least six months. Hot nights can cause geraniums to decline. Prune them back by ½ to ¾, cutting at a node right above a leaf and fertilize. When buying geraniums look for high humidity and heat tolerant varieties.

Continue pinching back chrysanthemums until early August. To keep annuals and perennials blooming, cut off dead flowers. Summer annuals such as marigolds and zinnias can still be seeded directly into ground for fall flowers. Sow basil seed to replace earlier basil that will soon go to seed. Trim back petunias to produce bushier plants and more flowers. Daffodils that didn't flower might be overcrowded. After leaves yellow, carefully dig up bulbs and carefully separate those that are loosely connected and re-plant. Collect larkspur seeds to sow in late fall. Fall flowering bulbs such as dahlias, gladioli, and cannas can be planted. After hydrangeas finish blooming they can be pruned as long as you do it before August 1st. The green caterpillars eating parsley will become beautiful Swallowtail butterflies.

Houseplants need regular fertilizing. If leaves of houseplants put outdoors get brown spots and die they might be getting too much light. When houseplants outgrow their pot, try cutting off the bottom half of roots and use the same pot with new soil on the bottom. Orchids can go outside now. Start them out in a shady spot. Fertilize them once a week with a very weak solution. Raise your lawn mower for the summer months to mow St. Augustine at 31/2", Centipede at 21/2", Zoysia at 2" and Bermuda at 11/2"
