

Apple, Cranberry, and Pear Crisp

- 2 Rome Beauty apples-peeled, cored, and cubed
- 2 Comice pears-peeled, cored, and cubed
- 1/2 cup dried cranberries
- 1 tablespoon all-purpose flour
- 2 tablespoons of honey
- 1 1/2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 1/2 cup of all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup packed brown sugar
- 1/2 cup quick cooking oats
- 1/4 cup ground walnuts
- 1/2 cup butter

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees F (190 degrees C). Lightly grease an 8 inch baking dish
- 2. Mix apples, pears, cranberries, 1 tablespoon flour, honey, and lemon juice in the prepared dish.
- 3. In a bowl, mix 1/2 cup flour, brown sugar, oats, walnuts, and butter to the consistency of coarse crumbs. Sprinkle loosely over the fruit mixture.
- 4. Bake 45 minutes in the preheated oven, or until brown and crisp on top.

Dear Brother Knights,

This has been a very unusual month, but one which should remind us that we never know what is going to happen tomorrow. The last two Council Business Meetings that I went to were each missing a Knight who was planning on being there. One was the Immediate Past Grand Knight, and the other was a man who has only been a Knight for a couple of months. The Immediate Past Grand Knight is Tom Kelly who was a Financial Secretary for over a decade and then the Grand Knight at the Mt. Pleasant Council. He passed away after a two week stay in the hospital. He was a strong Catholic and a great Knight. No one knew that he wouldn't make it to his 67th birthday. But he is now with the Lord. Then I went to Walterboro Council and Henry Cox, who is a new Knight, had a porch roof fall on him and was in the hospital with multiple fractures instead of at the meeting. I don't know Henry as well as I knew Tom, but he is a very strong Catholic too, and is planning on becoming a strong Knight. When I visited Henry, he said he was blessed that he was hurt but not killed. (Please keep these Knights and their families in your prayers.)

What is the message? Be prepared, financially as well as spiritually for the unexpected. We never know when the Lord will call us, but if He calls us tomorrow are we ready? If married and with children, will they have to depend on the charity of others? Will the Knights be called to attend the funeral and provide spiritual support, or will they be asked to help pay next month's bills? If you haven't had a review is awhile, now may be good time to contact your Knight's field agent to make sure you are as prepared financially as you thought you were.
