


Knight of the Month September, 2010 Donald J. (DJ) Thatcher

DJ is a native of Lancaster, Pa. and has been a life-long Catholic who attended Catholic elementary school and a Catholic College. Upon graduating from high school in 1980 he attended an accelerated paramedic program @ St. Joseph Hospital in Lancaster, and worked for several years on their Intensive Care Ambulance (one of the first in the nation) and gained extensive rescue experience. While serving as a medic, DJ attended college and received a nursing degree in 1985. For the next 21 years DJ primarily worked for himself as a nurse-contractor specializing in emergency and critical care at several hospitals in Harrisburg and Philadelphia. DJ was also a faculty member of a paramedic program and taught specialty medical programs at many hospitals in the Eastern U. S. DJ ended his clinical nursing career in 2006 after serving as a hospital administrator for 3 years. Today, he continues to donate his services to the Berkeley County EMS as an educator and paramedic on a limited basis. In an interesting career diversion in 2001-2002, he was given an opportunity to work as a TV and radio broadcaster for the news division of WGAL TV 8, and for Westwood-One Radio networks in central PA. Upon moving to Mount Pleasant in 2006, DJ began to focus his professional endeavors as a Performance Coach for Dale Carnegie Training, and as a network marketer, coaching people to run successful home businesses. Additionally, he is in the process of launching a new venture in September as a voice-over talent. The wonderful people who put up with all of this include his bride Allyson, who served as an active-duty physician in the U.S. Air Force, and today serves as a civilian contractor to the Air Force and Navy here in Charleston, and his 4 children: Michael who is in graduate school for music and theatre at the University of Nevada at Las Vegas; Olivia, a senior studying history at West Chester University near Philadelphia; Andrew, a junior at Bishop England and a member of the varsity basketball team; and Joseph, a 7th grader who attends a virtual charter school from home and who is a USTAranked tennis player.

DJ joined the Knights of Columbus in 2007 after serving for many years with Sertoma Club of Lancaster, PA. DJ is a Fourth-Degree Knight and has volunteered with the oyster roasts. Book sales, spaghetti dinners, Christmas wreath sales, and a few other projects. DJ is presently Deputy Grand Knight and chairs the re-election campaign of Jim Pancake.

DJ is a parishioner at Christ Our King Parish and serves as an usher and lector. He also assists with decorating the church during holidays. His wife Allyson serves in the Choir, and his son Joseph is a member of the Youth Choir.

In addition to all the career "stuff" noted previously, DJ continues to work a few times a year as a train conductor on the Strasburg Steam Railroad in Lancaster, PA, and is also a high school and college baseball umpire.





Family of the Month July, 2010 Rick and Michelle Karkowski



KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS EMBLEM



The emblem of the Order dates from the second Supreme Council meeting May 12, 1883, when it was designed by James T.Mullen, who was then Supreme Knight.

A quick glance at the emblem indicates a shield mounted upon the Formee Cross. The shield is that associated with a medieval Knight. The Formee Cross is the representation of a traditionally artistic design of Cross of Christ through which all graces of redemption were procured for mankind. This then represents the Catholic spirit of the Order.

Mounted on the shield are three objects: a fasces standing vertically, and, crossed behind it, an anchor and a dagger or short sword. The fasces from Roman days is symbolic of authority which must exist in any tightly-bonded and efficiently operating organization. The anchor is the mariner's symbol for Columbus, patron of the Order, while the short sword of dagger was the weapon of the Knight when engaged upon an errand of mercy. Thus, the shield expresses Catholic Knighthood in organized merciful action, and with the letters, K.of C., it proclaims this specific form of activity.

The red, white and blue in the background of the shield and the foreground of the Cross of Malta are the colors of our country. As such, red is the symbol of hope, of calm tranquility under God and of confidence in the protection of our country. White is the symbol of nobility of purpose, of purity of aim and of crucible - tried ideals to be carried out.

But there is another symbolism of color in red, white and blue. This is the ecclesiastical symbolism in which red becomes the reflection of the drips of Christ's redemptive blood shed upon Calvary, and of the martyr's blood shed in defense of the faith.

Red then is the symbol of Faith, of belief in Christ, in the Redemption and in the knowledge and love of Jesus Christ. White is the color of the Eucharistic Host, pledge of God's Eucharistic presence among men, of the infinite love God has for man and the overwhelming affection which the God-man has for each individual. White then is the symbol of Christ-like Charity. Blue is the color of Our Lady's mantle, in which she wrapped her beloved Son, through Whom came salvation to a sinful world. Blue is then the symbol of Hope.
