'We Dare Not Forget'

Kennedy's historic speech urged us to remember the divine source of our rights and civic responsibilities

Fifty years ago this month, John F. Kennedy was sworn in as president of the United States. His inaugural address inspired a generation of Americans, and his words "Ask not what your country can do for you; ask what you can do for your country" became the byword of a generation. Those words, coming toward the end of the address, were its rhetorical highpoint. But the speech's intellectual foundation came at the beginning, when Kennedy asserted that "the same revolutionary beliefs for which our forebears fought are still at issue around the globe — the belief that the rights of man come not from the generosity of the state, but from the hand of God."

He concluded his speech this way: "[L]et us go forth to lead the land we love, asking his blessing and his help, but knowing that here on earth, God's work must truly be our own." Kennedy had just won one of the closest and most controversial elections in American history. Much of the opposition centered upon the prejudice that a Catholic could not serve as president. In this regard, some might have expected Kennedy to downplay the theme of religion in his speech. But

The South Carolina State Council expresses their profound sadness at this loss. Also, in the recent shootings in Tucson, the victims included U.S. District Court Judge John M. Roll, a Fourth Degree Knight who had just come from Mass when he was shot with five others.

Javier Heredia

Javier Heredia has not had an easy life. He started to work when he was six, and since then he has always worked in order to support his family. He was the oldest and his mother was a single mom. Javier grew up in Ciudad Juarez, just across the border from El Paso, Texas. His hometown was known for the violence

produced by the drug lords and their illegal activities. He was lost until a priest came to his rescue and talked to him about Jesus and his love. “After a retreat, I went to confession and listened to the most beautiful words I had ever heard, “God, the Father of mercies, through the death and resurrection of his Son has reconciled the world to himself and sent the Holy Spirit among us for the forgiveness of sins; through the ministry of the Church may God give you pardon and peace, and I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit”. I will never forget the words of the priest after absolution. He said to me. “Do not let people label you. Do not get confused. Your true identity is being a son of God, a brother of Jesus Christ, and a temple of the Holy Spirit.

“After that I entered the seminary in 1993 and a year later, I left the seminary in order to pay a debt. To do so, I immigrated to South Carolina and worked for ten years on a farm. Finally the debt was paid and I was ready to go back to Mexico, but our former bishop, Bishop Baker invited me to join our diocese and that is how I ended up here. I have been a seminarian since 2004 when I was sent to a seminary in Mexico City. When I was transferred to the States I had to start all over again because the credits that I brought from there were not accepted here.

“Once I was praying before the Blessed Sacrament looking for excuses not to enter the seminary and suddenly a nun sat next to me and started to tell me the story of her vocation. She shared with me her fears and doubts. Amazingly what she faced at her time was exactly what I was experiencing at that moment. I am convinced that God sent her to give some answers and encouragement to enter the seminary and begin this beautiful adventure called formation.

“God always sends people to make himself known. I recently received one of the most powerful proofs of God’s love. In

is diabetic and got gangrene in her leg. Thanks to God, the gangrene disappeared and my mom survived that experience. Later, in September 2009, my ten-year-old sister Christina was diagnosed with cancer and she was told that she had less than a month to live, with a very low chance of survival. In Mexico, she could not be treated because in our country, they do not have the resources to treat that kind of cancer. We brought Christina to the USA but since she is not citizen of this country, we could not find the way for her to receive the proper treatment. This is a long story that is full of miracles, one after the other. After over a year full of hope and fears, faith and struggles, my sister has been declared cancer free. She is going to be taking chemo for two more years and will undergo physical therapy in order to help her walk normally. Our intercessor was John Paul II and I have no doubts of the efficacy of him as intercessor. I do not know what else can I say about me, everything I am is because of God's love. I am looking forward to serve God in his people in our diocese as a priest."

Worthy Grand Knights and Members of the State Council:

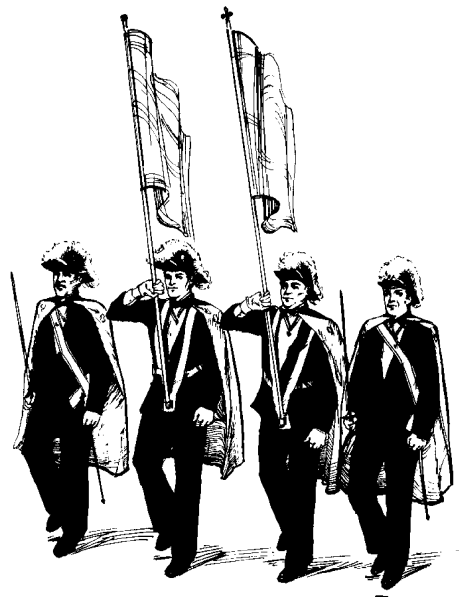

he did not.

If it were to have taken place amid the political landscape of today, Kennedy's election would have been less controversial than his words. Given the ongoing debate over religion in American life, his inaugural address would have generated enormous disagreement.

Though some today might be shocked by the presence of religious ideals in a speech of this importance, such sentiments have been prominent throughout American history. Kennedy's predecessor, President Dwight D. Eisenhower, began his first inaugural address with a prayer he had composed. Eisenhower said, "At such a time in history, we who are free must proclaim anew our faith. This faith is the abiding creed of our fathers. It is our faith in the deathless dignity of man, governed by eternal moral and natural laws."

Both Kennedy and Eisenhower understood that the "abiding creed of our fathers," and those "revolutionary beliefs" for which they fought, had been summarized by Thomas Jefferson in the Declaration of Independence when he wrote that each of us has been endowed by our Creator with certain unalienable rights.

We might well say that the 20th century was defined by the struggle between those committed to the proposition that our rights "come not from the generosity of the state, but from the hand of God" and those who seek to replace those "eternal moral and natural laws" with the unlimited power of the state. Both Kennedy and Eisenhower understood this, and it was one of the reasons they supported the initiative in the 1950s to add the words "under God" to the U.S. Pledge of Allegiance — a cause that was championed by the Knights of Columbus. In my recent book *Beyond a House Divided: The Moral Consensus Ignored by Washington, Wall Street and the Media*, I have put forward statistical evidence showing that the American people by a large majority remain committed to the moral foundations of our country. These findings should give us confidence as we continue to promote the traditional moral values that offer the best hope for the future of our nation and the world.

Some may say that these "revolutionary beliefs" should be a thing of the past. But in his inaugural address, Kennedy himself made the best response to this contention: "We dare not forget today that we are the heirs of that first revolution" and that we are "unwilling to witness or permit the slow undoing of those human rights to which this nation has always been committed."

May the Knights of Columbus remain steadfast in the defense of those "revolutionary beliefs" about which our brother Knight and first Catholic president spoke so eloquently.
